4. First-aid measures

Inhalation	Move to fresh air. Call a physician if symptoms develop or persist.

Prevent entry into waterways, sewer, basements or confined areas. Following product recovery, flush area with water.</p> <p>Small spills: Wipe up with absorbent material (e.g. cloth, fleece). Clean surface thoroughly to remove residual contamination.</p> <p>Never return spills to original container for re-use. For waste disposal, see section 13 of the SDS.</p>
